PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN TRAINS



In 1948 Harry Truman seemed to be the underdog as he ran for election in his own right after having come into the Presidency upon the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt in April 1945. He ran against New York's Thomas E. Dewey (the Republican nominee) and Strom Thurmond (a 3rd party "States Rights" or "Dixiecrat"). To everyone's surprise Harry won, garnering 303 Electoral votes to Dewey's 189. He is seen here on the rear platform of one of his campaign trips in that pivotal time just after the end of World War II but before the Korean War.

The use of trains in Presidential elections and for other purposes has a long and fascinating history almost from railroading's beginnings right up to our modern age. Join us at the January Chapter meeting as Mark (MJ) Lewandowski takes us on an in-depth dive into this history.



A CSX stack train highballs eastbound to Buffalo near Sheridan, NY on December 20, 2024. Winter along the former New York Central Water Level Route west of Buffalo can have its moments of blinding lake-effect snow. This is a far cry from the picture at left of a snowbound depot in Eden Center NY on the former Erie Buffalo & Southwestern branch, now Buffalo Southern. 

- International Railway Company Car #2002 (Kuhlman Car Company, 1916), a Niagara Falls High-Speed car, in Buffalo, NY
- CSX Transportation ES44AH #911 & #1976 (General Electric, July 2008 & May 2012) are both wearing special paint schemes
- Lehigh Valley Railroad GP-9 #300 (Electro Motive Division, September 1959) is at the Tifft Street diesel locomotive service track
- New York, Chicago & St. Louis Railroad Nickel Plate 2-8-4 S-3 Berkshire #776 (Lima Locomotive Works, May 1949) in Pomfret, NY
- Chessie System Sperry Rail Service car #136 (J.G. Brill Company, 1928) was built for the New York Central RR as Doodlebug car M-1
 Conrail U33-B #2909 (General Electric, September-1968 built for Penn Central) is westbound on train HB-1 in Alden, NY
- Baltimore & Ohio 2-8-0 class E-60 #3140 (Alco-Brooks Locomotive Works, 1908, ex-Buffalo & Susquehanna #166) at Westfield, PA
- Arcade & Attica Railroad 4-6-0 #14 (Baldwin Locomotive Works, February 1917) is passing the depot in Arcade, NY


ELECTION OF CHAPTER OFFICERS

LAST RUN

As noted by Jim Ball at the December meeting, we sadly announce the unexpected passing of long-time Chapter member and board member Dave Skoney. Dave died last month just a few days before the meeting and we are told he had been active up almost to the end. Dave served faithfully in various director positions for many years, and he will be missed. I recall him providing a great photo for use on the cover of the ESX many years ago when I was preparing to do a program on the Lehigh Valley Railroad. The image of a passenger train leaving Buffalo's once fabulous downtown LVRR terminal pulled by a set of Alco PA diesel engines in the early 1950s remains one of my all-time favorite rail pictures of Buffalo. When he brought the photo to me so I could scan it for reprinting, Dave recalled some memories he had of those all too brief glory years just after the end of World War II but before the automobile and air travel decimated the LVs rail passenger trade. Those first- hand recollections that folks like Dave could tell us are unfortunately becoming a rare commodity. The Chapter extends its sincere condolences to Dave's family.

The Northeast Corridor – David Alff

My new book offers the first comprehensive history of America's most important inter-city passenger railroad, and the region it built. It shows how a fistful of train tracks transformed America's Atlantic shoreline into a political capital, a global financial hub, and home to fifty million people. *The Northeast Corridor* reveals how freight trains, commuter rail, and Amtrak influenced—and in turn were shaped by—centuries of American industrial expansion, metropolitan growth, downtown decline, and revitalization. In this talk, I will discuss how I came to research the corridor, what I learned while writing the book, and how I hope it can spark conversations within and beyond the rail heritage community.
